**Part 2.** Generate a list of 10 activities or tasks (in different areas, musical or otherwise) that could benefit from an *interactive AI* approach/mindset. For each of these, with as much as specificity as you can muster in a single sentence, describe how it would work. (Extra point for challenging existing assumptions/ways of doing things)
