. Summary of Proposal:

The Stanford Center for Computer Music is major center for computer music in the United States. CCRMA provides an interdisciplinary environment where composers can produce new works which reflect the scientifictechnological riches of the present. Since 1966, the facilities at CCRMA have been used by composers to realize works that have been presented in concert and radio broadcasts throughout Europe and the U.S. Several compositions have won international and national awards. Support is needed to provide and enhance access to CCRMA's unique facility to composers/artists and to develop the viability of extending new musical experiences to the public.

For the past three years, we have received grants from NEA under "Centers for New Music Resources" for equipment and will receive support from Rockefeller Foundation to support "artists in residence". We are seeking support from CAC to help with the ongoing support of the facility to ensure the accessibility of this vital new music resource to composers and artists. Salary support for an audio engineer and support for the maintenance costs of the Center's digital synthesizer/processor and audio equipment behefit greatly the composer/artists ability to make maximum use of the facility.

History and purpose of your organization:

Since 1966, the Stanford Center for Computer Music has been dedicated to the development of the computer as a new musical and artistic medium. In 1975, a joint grant was received from the National Science Foundation and the National Endowment for the Arts for research and teaching in computer techniques of interactive sound production and computing equipment for musical purposes. A major aim of the center has been to establish a facility where researchers, composers, and students can work with strong-based technological support to enhance their compositional and creative capabilities.

Administration:

The center is associated with the Music Department of Stanford University and is under the general managerial and fiscal responsibility of Stanford University. The center is directed by John Chowning, Professor of Music at Stanford and co-directed by composer Loren Rush. Other members of the staff include an administrator, a computer programmer, a computer technician, and an audio engineer (to be hired). The facility consists of a central computer processor, a specially built digital synthesizer/processor, a display system having 12 video terminals, and 3 large capacity disk drives. A special studio contains professional quality tape recorders, mixer, and 4 channels of amplifiers and speakers. Two additional lab spaces contain 4 channels of amplifiers and speakers.

Communities you serve:

The facility is available to students, researchers and composers. Each year CCRMA presents concerts, demonstrations and workshops of computer music. CCRMA also makes available tapes of compositions for festivals and broadcasts. Concerts are presented to a broad cross-section of the public. Demonstrations are given to the public at large and to groups of students and interested organizations.
