We propose to produce the second and third discs of an ongoing series of recordings of works by American composers produced at CCRMA, Stanford University's Center for Computer Research in Music and Acoustics. The first recording of the series is of works by Michael McNabb, currently in production.

Works created at CCRMA use some of the most sophisticated musical technology currently available. These recordings will match this standard by assuring that, at every level in the process, the very highest audio production standards will be attained.

This music is created and stored in digital form. We will use a digital tape recorder and specially designed interface to transfer the signal directly from CCRMA's digital synthesizer to the tape recorder. This master will be used to cut the record. 2500 copies of each record will be pressed and the records will be distributed by 1750 Arch Records, Berkeley, California.
