Dear Mr. Surra:

By letter of May 16, 1974 the above invention was disclosed. In that letter we indicated the University's plans to petition for greater rights in the invention.

Upon careful investigation, including interaction with a potential licensee, we have found that the reverberator in its present embodiment would not be commercially competitive and thus wish to advise you that the University does not plan to petition for greater rights nor file a patent application.

It is possible that future research findings, when applied to the present invention, may make it commercially competitive. In such event, we would plan to resubmit a new invention disclosure.
