
# the Recyclero





### Manifesto

All too often, the conversation surrounding environmental awareness is strong, but our actions tend to focus on the most convenient option, which is rarely environmentally friendly. Sorting waste in particular, is a concept that seems simple and has a grand effect; by sorting our waste into recyclables, compost, and landfill, we can better manage humanity's waste production and decrease our environmental impact.


With the recyclero, I envision a world where environmental consciousness becomes a concept of the subconscious. No longer do individuals need to worry about actively sorting their waste. The recyclero transforms sorting into the standard; with this device, users no longer need to consciously concern themselves with sorting waste. Instead, they can continue on the visceral level of behavior, throwing their waste into a general compartment and allowing the machine to complete the activity.

There is simplicity in the design of the recyclero: each object has an intended purpose. Whether it be the lights which act as signifiers or the titanium material for durability, each aspect of the formal design was carefully planned.

However, there is still an aesthetic dimension to the design. There is beauty in effective and efficient machines, that are both robust and elegant. Like a child fascinated by a new toy, we hope that individuals will also be fascinated with the inner-workings of the recyclero. For some, the process of watching the machine work could even become a game; predicting when it will be accurate and when the user might need to intervene (although this is hopefully never).

The machine fulfills the eudaemonic loop; not only is it a design to make an individual's life better, but also a design that is meant to improve humanity as a whole. By making recycling a visceral action, our design strives to make the earth a better place for all of the population, as well as our future.
